
I guess I would be remiss without reminding you all that we do have to come back on January 6th. Until then though I wish you all








in and do their parts. Together we make it work! The Grade 4 class performed an energetic country line-dance called A Real Live Country Christmas. Great job

GRADE FIVE NEWS



The gym was full of parents, family and community to cheer on the Huskies. Tournament Convener Mrs. Karma Hawkins had done a fantastic job of organizing the weekend. Over 75 students, as well as staff and community volunteers worked in all aspects of the weekend activities. This included canteen workers, scorekeepers, team greeters, banquet workers, web cam operators, decorators, photographers, door workers and floor sweepers. The banquet featured guest speaker Russ Paddock, current Athletic Director at Brandon University and former Bobcat Volleyball Coach and Men's National Team player. Each class in Kindergarten to Grade 8, 'adopted' one of the teams at the tournament. Members of the team visited the classes and the students came to cheer on their team for a game.




